An evening organised by Jersey Aero Club and AOPA




A large group of local pilots gathered at the Jersey Aero Club to hear first-hand about the remarkable events of the 3rd November last year when the crew of PA32, GWINS, suffered engine problems off Jersey's south-east coast and were forced to ditch into rough seas. Thanks to their correct actions and calmness throughout, they were successfully rescued and returned to the island unharmed.

Pilots Paul Clifford and Duncan Laisney gave a detailed account of the event from the moment the engine stopped responding to the time they were picked up.


Paul and Duncan were supported by excellent presentations by Jersey ATC and the Jersey Coastguard and RNLI crews involved in the rescue.



















Stay

PFD and liferaft essential




Chance very slim But always fly prepared and if it does be confident - you can handle it • Survive the impact • Escape the aircraft • Survive the sea • Communicate well and trust the professionals to rescue you

Fly prepared survival equipment Life jackets on before take off Life raft – easily accessible Emergency / ditching bag - waterproof PLB – registered Radio Strobe light Mobile phone Dye Sea sickness tabs Hat / bobble cap Ensure all occupants properly briefed

Service all equipment regularly

Most people know little about life jackets and absolutely nothing about life rafts

Student solo X country flights over France

Following an AOPA CI initiative, local PPL students may, once again, fly the required solo x country flights over France. An agreement was made with the French CAA (DSAC/DGAC) which allows these qualifying solo flights to take place without any further requirements.

The new agreement applies across the Channel Islands and obviates the need for this part of the PPL training to be conducted in the U.K.
