

JERSEY NAVIGATION SURVEY - 2030 PBN MANDATE

Ports of Jersey Limited (PoJL) is conducting a survey to assess the present navigation capability of all its airlines and aircraft users. This is to determine the future strategy of the 'Ground Based Aids' that it presently manages and to prepare for future changes in regulation and to ensure it meets any new requirements. Jersey is very lucky, in so far as, it has a choice of multiple approach types, precision and non-precision as well as the full set of RNP approaches including LPV200. The next major regulation change is the 2030 PBN mandate which takes effect on 6th June 2030.

Put simply, the PBN mandate means a transition from conventional nav aids and procedures to performance-based navigation. PBN IR identifies the navigation specifications and functionalities to be used for enroute ATS routes, standard instrument departure routes (SID), standard arrival routes (STAR), and approach procedures. These routes and approach procedures are to be based on RNAV 1, RNP 1, RNP 0.3, RNAV 5, RNP APCH (to LNAV, LNAV/VNAV and LPV minima), etc.

The questions here are aimed at local G.A. pilots who fly IFR, so using instrument procedures. Your responses will help PoJL make a better assessment of present capability against that expected by 2030. It will also influence any decision as to which 'classic 'nav aids, if any, need to be retained.
